UNSW Course Outline

This course will provide a comprehensive overview of emotions research, how this produces

feelings of stress and how these concepts relate to some of the most common mental disorders - depression and anxiety disorders. Students will learn about psychology as a science and how psychological festerch is performed (including animal and buman studies). Throughout the course we will examine how the f ndings from this research informs the clinical description of disorders and the treatment of anxiety, stress and low mood.

This course is appropriate for students with and without a background in bacience and isntaught entirely online through Moodle. The f nal exam will be held online during the formal exam period.

N.B. This course is not a treatment program for mental health disorders and should not be viewed as a substitute for professional intervention.

Course Aims

The general aim of this course is to examine clinical psychology perspectives on some of the most commonly Odcurring meretal disorders in the general population. The disorders to be examined include the anxiety disorders (e.g. specific phobia, panic disorder) and mood disorders (e.g. major depressive disorder). The course will focus on the nature of emotions and the role that they play in depression and the mixiety disorders. The course will also examine strategies for mjonaging stress.
